General Conditions of Play

1. Any lady member who is either a full financial member or a Junior member of the Nambour Golf Club with a current GA handicap is eligible to play in the Ladies Club Competitions.
2. Visitors
 - a. Visitors may play in the Ladies Club Competitions if they can provide proof of their club membership and proof of handicap.
 - b. Visitors will pay ½ green fees plus competition fees. (If it is the Open Day or a special Invitation Day, they will pay the competition fee.)
 - c. Visitors are ineligible to participate in the Ladies Club Championships and Single Match Play events.
 - d. Visitors are eligible to win the trophy of the day – either gross or nett except on Monthly Medal days.
3. A player who wins the competition trophy is ineligible to win a ball in the rundown. This includes Open Day or any special Invitation Days.
4. A trophy for a birdie will only be awarded in a single event or a fourball aggregate.
5. A NTP trophy will be awarded to a player who holes out on a par 3 in two strokes if that was the requirement to win even though another player may have a hole-in-one on that hole. If this occurs, the trophy will be shared.
6. All competitions will be decided by the Match Committee of the day.
7. Events are played in divisions depending on the size of the field and at the discretion of the Match Committee. The handicap ranges for events with 2 or 3 divisions may change from year to year.
8. Divisions, dates and trophies for all competitions are determined by the Match Committee. Events, sponsors and dates are published in the Nambour Golf Club's Members Fixture Book.
9. The hit-off time for designated ladies' competitions is adjusted seasonally or as required. Earlier hit-off is available for players with work and unexpected commitments. The Match Committee has the right to vary the times. The use of the early time slot is at the discretion of the Match Committee.
10. In all single stroke competitions, a small trophy is given for the best gross score.
11. Deciding Ties

If the method of deciding ties is not stated in the relevant Conditions of Play, ties will be decided using the Australian Count Back System. Score cards will be matched. The winner is determined on the basis of the best score for the last nine holes. If the tying players have the same score for the last nine holes, the winner will be determined on the basis of the best score for the last six holes, then the last three holes and if a tie still exists, then hole by hole back from the 18th. For stroke competitions, the relevant fraction of the player's handicap is deducted from the gross score to enable the nett scores to be compared.
12. Protests must be lodged in writing within 30 minutes of completion of play and before presentation commences.
13. Club members who hole-in-one during club competitions scheduled for 18 holes (including pennants) will have their names entered on the Hole-in-One Honour Board. They will receive an appropriate trophy, 1 dozen golf balls and a caricature. Visitors have their name entered on the Hole-in-One Honour Board and receive an appropriate trophy. The same rewards apply for 'Albatrosses'. Eagles are recognized on Par 4 holes as well as on Par 5 holes for female members. The trophy for an eagle is 8 balls. Female members also receive an Eagle badge. Eagles and albatrosses will not be recognized on holes with temporary tees or greens. Holes-in-one will be recognized on par 3 holes with either a temporary tee or green.
14. Mobile phones may be carried for on course emergency only but must be turned off or in mute mode.

15. Distance measuring devices may be used for measuring distances only.
16. All players using motorized transport are eligible to win any gross, net or match play event. The current Zone policy for motorised transport is adopted for all competitions.
17. The Ladies Committee pays for each pennant player's lunch to the value of \$10. Lunches are handled by the pennant team captain.
18. Competition fees in Rose Bowl events will be met by participating players.
19. Annual competition perpetual trophies may be held by the winners for two weeks and then displayed in the clubhouse.
20. Swingers in a four ball competition
In order to allow players without partners to play in a four ball competition, the Committee will allow this player to play in a group of three with one player being a swinger.
The following conditions will apply:
 - The swinger will be the lady with the lowest handicap of the remaining pair on the line
 - The swinger can win a trophy or a ball in the rundown with her first partner only.
 - If the swinger and her second partner have the best score, only the player who had no partner may win the trophy not the swinger.
 - If the swinger and her second partner's score is in the ball rundown, only the player who had no partner may win the ball not the swinger.

LADIES GOLF CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS

CONDITIONS OF PLAY

1. All lady members who are either full financial or junior members of the Nambour Golf Club may participate in this event.
2. The event is a 54 holes competition played as 4 x 18 holes stroke rounds played over 4 x consecutive Thursdays. The winners of each division will be decided by counting the best two gross and nett scores of the first 3 rounds plus the gross and nett score for the final round. To clarify the final round must be played and counts towards the total score.
3. The event is play in two divisions – As determined by the Match Committee prior to the commencement of all competitions.
4. Champions have their names engraved on the perpetual Championship trophy and also receive a prize in the form of a voucher. If a Division 2 player becomes the Club Champion, that player is also awarded the Division 2 Championship title, has her name engraved on the Championship perpetual trophy but receives only the Club Championship voucher. If this occurs, a Division 1 Best Gross voucher will be awarded for the Division 1 Best Gross. A player may not win more than one trophy.
5. Trophies are awarded as follows:
 - Club Champion - Best Gross
 - Division 2 Champion - Best Gross Division 2
 - Division 1 Best Nett
 - Division 2 Best Nett
6. Players' daily handicaps each round will be used in determining the Championship nett scores. Players will remain in the Division in which they started in round 1 regardless of a change to daily handicap during the championship.
7. All rounds will be time sheet starts. Consideration will be given to those requiring earlier or later times for health or work commitments as well as those who need to use and share a motorised cart. Determination of tee times is at the discretion of the Match Committee.
8. Ties for gross events will be decided by a play of holes 1, 8 and 9. If no result is achieved there will be a sudden death hole by hole playoff of 1, 8 and 9, until a winner is decided.
9. Ties for nett scores will be decided in accordance with the Australian Count back System. For the 72 holes nett event, compare nett scores for the last 18 holes and if still tied, compare nett scores for the last 9 etc.
10. Any dispute or claim must be lodged with the Match Committee within 15 minutes of the players involved, completing their round. The Match Committee's decision will be final.
11. An additional day being a 'substitute day' will be nominated. If one of the rounds of play is cancelled for any reason, the substitute day will be used. If play on this day is also unable to proceed for any reason, then the Championships will be decided over the 54 holes that have been completed.

12. If carts aren't allowed on the course due to the course conditions, then the round will be cancelled and the substitute day used.
13. Distance measuring devices may be used for measuring distances only.
14. Mobile telephones may be carried in the case of emergency on the course only, but must be turned off or in mute mode.
15. The Match Committee's decision is final in all matters relating to the Ladies Club Championships.

FOURSOMES CHAMPIONSHIPS

CONDITIONS OF PLAY

1. All lady members who are either full financial or junior members of the Nambour Golf Club with a current GA handicap are eligible to play in the Ladies Foursomes Championships competition.
2. It is a 27 holes stroke event played in one day.
3. The Foursomes Championship is an Honour Board event.
4. The winners of the Foursomes Championship are the players with the best gross round. The winners' names are engraved on the Foursomes Championship perpetual trophy and they also receive a small trophy with the championship title and year to retain.
5. Trophies in the form of vouchers are awarded for:
 - Best Gross – 27 holes
 - Best Nett – 27 holes
 - Best Nett – 1st 18 holes
 - Best Nett – 2nd 9 holes
6. Players may not win more than one trophy.
7. Ties for the gross event will be decided by a playoff over holes 1, 8 and 9. If no result is achieved there will be a sudden death hole-by-hole play of 1, 8 and 9 until a winner is decided.
8. Ties in nett scores will be decided in accordance with the Australian Countback System. For ties in the 27 holes net event, compare net scores for the last 18 holes and if still tied, then compare the last 9, etc. For ties in the 18 holes net event, compare net scores for the last 9 holes and if still tied, then compare the last 6, etc.
9. Any dispute or claim must be lodged with the Match Committee within 15 minutes of the players involved, completing their round. The Match Committee's decision will be final.
10. If carts aren't allowed on the course due to the course conditions, then the round will be postponed to a later date determined by the Match Committee.
11. Distance measuring devices may be used for measuring distances only.
12. Mobile telephones may be carried for on course emergency only, but must be turned off or in mute mode.
13. The Match Committee's decision is final in all matters relating to the Ladies Foursomes Championships.

Conditions of Play – Lady Members Events

Monthly Medal

- a. The Monthly Medal is a single stroke competition played over 18 holes in 2 divisions. The Match Committee determines the divisions at the start of the year.
- b. The Monthly Medal is played over 7 rounds and held on the first Thursday of the month from March to September.
- c. The nett winner of each division wins a trophy.
- d. The best gross score on the day wins a small trophy.
- e. Any ties are decided by the Australian Countback System.
- f. A putting competition is held in conjunction with Monthly Medal days. A small trophy is awarded to the player with the least putts.

Monthly Medal Final

- a. The Monthly Medal Final is the annual play off, of all the Monthly Medal winners. It is a single stroke competition played in 2 divisions.
- b. The winners are the best nett in each of the 2 divisions.
- c. Winners play in the division in which they spent the majority of the season This is determined using the daily handicap of the player on each of the 7 competitions regardless of whether they played in every monthly medal competition.
- d. In the event of the best nett score being tied, the winner of the final will be decided by an 18 hole single stroke play off on a date determined by the Match Committee. If the play off results in a tie, the Australian Countback system will be used to decide the winner.
- e. The winners' names are engraved on the perpetual trophies. Winners are also awarded a personal trophy.

Open Day

- a. This event is an 18 holes Single Stroke event open to all players with a Golf Australia handicap.
- b. The handicap ranges for 3 divisions are determined by the Match Committee after nominations are received.
- c. Trophies are awarded for:
 - 18 Holes Gross in 3 divisions
 - 18 Holes Nett in 3 divisions
 - 18 Holes Gross Runner Up in 3 divisions
 - 18 Holes Nett Runner Up in 3 Divisions
 - 18 Holes Nett - Senior Women
- d. Players may not receive more than one major trophy but may also receive the Senior Women's trophy.
- e. Winners do not receive a ball in the rundown.
- f. This event is played in conjunction with the North Coast Zone Nett Pennant competition. The Nett Pennant competition is run in accordance with the North Coast Zone's Conditions of Play.
- g. A copy of the Nambour Ladies Golf Club Conditions of Play for Open Day is in a separate document.

Invitation Day N/A

- a. This event is a 4 Person Ambrose open to all amateur women golfers who have a Golf Australia handicap.
- b. Trophies are awarded to the Winners and Runners Up.
- c. Winners do not receive a ball in the rundown.
- d. A copy of the Nambour Ladies Golf Club Conditions of Play for Invitation Day is in a separate document.

Best Handicap Reduction

- a. A trophy is awarded to the player who has the greatest reduction in handicap during the competition year 1st March to 31st October. All lady members who are full financial or junior members of the Nambour Golf Club are eligible to receive this trophy.

Annual Weekday Competitions

Nomination fee of \$10.00 is payable by the end of February.

Competition year from 1st February to the 31st October.

One **Golf Queensland competition** will be played in 2017 - the Gertrude McLeod competition which is played in 3 Divisions:

Division 1	0 - 20
Division 2	20.1 - 27
Division 3	27.1 - 45

Nambour Ladies' Golf Club Annual competitions are played in either one or two divisions.

A player changing divisions during the year will compete in the division in which she played the majority of competitions.

Eclectic

Played in 2 divisions as determined by the match committee at the start of all competition.

Scores from weekday single events run by the Ladies Committee including Nambour Ladies Open Day may be used.

3/8 of player's exact handicap (GA) at beginning of last round of competition is deducted from final gross score to determine winners in each grade. Ties decided by countback system – last 9, 6, 3.

A player's GA handicap should determine the division that player is in at the conclusion of the last round played in the competition.

This event may be entered later in the year for a fee of \$2.00.

Best 8 Nett Stroke Cards

Played in 2 divisions.

Best 8 Nett stroke rounds played midweek at Nambour during the competition year. DSR to be used in determining best scores. A player who is disqualified because of failure to sign the card (Rule 6-6b) may use her nett score. Disqualification where there is no legitimate nett score cannot be used.

In the event that 8 Nett stroke rounds cannot be achieved due to weather or global issues, then the number of Nett stroke rounds played by the 31st October of the competition year will be the number used to determine the winner.

Ties decided by the next best Nett card (9th, 10th etc) until winner is decided.

Garney Hungerford Memorial Shield for Putting

Played in 1 division.

Annual putting competition played in conjunction with the Monthly Medal competitions and the Monthly Medal Final.

Aggregate of the best 4 rounds to decide winner. Ties decided by adding another round until a winner is decided.

Consistency Event

Played in 1 division.

Trophy to player with most points. Points are awarded as follows for these scores and events.

Better than DSR	=	4 points
Equal DSR to DSR +2	=	3 points
DSR+3 to DSR+5	=	2 points
DSR+6 or more	=	1 point
4BBB players	=	1 point each
18 holes foursomes	=	1 point each
36 holes	=	2 points each
Ambrose	=	1 point each

1 point also awarded for representing our club on Open Days in our Division which include a Nett Pennant competition.

Updated 11th Feb 2023

In the event of a tie, the player with the least number of 1 point in single events at Nambour is the winner. If a tie still exists, it is the player with least number of 2 points etc.

NAMBOUR LADIES' INVITATION DAY
CONDITIONS OF PLAY

1. This event is an 18 hole 4 Person Ambrose open to all players with a Golf Australia handicap.
2. The draw will be made one week before the event. After that date, no refunds will be made on cancellation. Substitutions will be allowed. The draw will be emailed to participating clubs. The Committee has the power to change positions of the players in the field if required.
3. All ties will be decided using the Australian Countback System.
4. Players may win one major trophy only. Trophies are awarded to the winners and runners up. Winners do not receive a ball in the rundown.
5. The event will be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf and the Local Rules.
6. The Committee shall settle any dispute or protest which must be submitted in writing at the Clubhouse no later than 15 minutes after completion of the player's round.
7. The Committee may alter or make any variations to the conditions of the event.
8. Players must report at least 30 minutes prior to commencement of play.
9. Mobile phones may be carried on the course but must be turned off or on silent mode.
10. Use of distance measuring devices must be limited to measuring distances only.

NAMBOUR LADIES, OPEN DAY
CONDITIONS OF PLAY

1. This event is an 18 hole stroke competition open to all players with a Golf Australia handicap and is played in conjunction with the North Coast Zone Pennant Competition.
2. The Ladies Match Committee reserves the right to limit the number of entries and may ballot entries to reduce the size of the field as per North Coast Zone Nett Pennant Division.
3. The draw will be made one week before the event. After that date, no refunds will be made on cancellations. Substitutions will be allowed. The draw will be emailed to participating clubs and posted on the SCBDWG website. The Committee has the power to change positions of the players in the field if required.
4. All ties will be decided using the Australian Countback System.
5. Trophies will be awarded in 3 divisions in this order:
Best Gross, Best Nett, Best Gross Runner Up, Best Nett Runner Up.
Trophy winners do not receive a ball in the run down.
6. Players may win one major trophy only but may also receive the trophy for the Senior Women's Best Nett.
7. The event will be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf together with the Local Rules.
8. The Committee may alter or make any variations in the conditions of the event, should they deem it necessary. Please check notices before play.
9. Players must register at least 30 min prior to the commencement of play.
10. Mobile phones may be carried on the course but must be turned off or on silent mode.
11. Use of distance measuring devices must be limited to measuring distance only.....
12. Motorised buggies must be booked by players phoning the Golf Shop on 5441 2049
